Comments:	I live at 4 Sunningdale Road, which is the semi-detached property directly next door to the application site, sharing a party wall and roof structure.

I would like to make clear that this is not an objection to the principle of the extension itself. However, I respectfully request that careful consideration be given to the impact on neighbouring amenity, particularly during the construction phase.

Our baby is due on 16th April, and we will shortly have a newborn in the property. As our homes are structurally connected (shared wall and roof), I am concerned about the potential transmission of noise, vibration, and general disturbance from building works directly into our living space. Excessive noise or disruption could affect the health, rest, and wellbeing of my newborn and family, particularly as newborns sleep frequently throughout the day and require a relatively calm environment.

I am also concerned about dust and debris during the warmer months. As the

property is directly next door, there may be periods where we feel unable to open windows due to construction dust. With a newborn in the house during spring and summer, being unable to ventilate the property could increase the risk of overheating, which poses a potential health concern.

Given the imminent arrival of our newborn, I would be grateful if the council could consider whether construction could be scheduled or delayed, or whether reasonable measures could be applied to reduce the impact on our family during this period.

I understand that construction works are temporary; however, given the timing and the structural connection between the properties, I respectfully ask that the council consider whether reasonable conditions relating to construction hours, noise mitigation, and dust control could be applied to minimise the impact on neighbouring residents.
